

Job Description for SILCC-HFH Lunchmaker Ministry

MISSION STATEMENT: To provide lunches on the third Friday of the month for delivery on Saturday morning to the home building volunteers working at the job sites for Habitat for Humanity.

JOB DESCRIPTION:

Each lunchmaker volunteer will supply the ingredients, make ten (10) lunches, and provide a 6-pack or 12-pack of drinks for use during the lunch break and throughout the working day.

Each lunch is to include a sandwich, a bag of chips, a fruit, and the drink packs.

Each lunchmaker volunteer must deliver their lunches on the third Friday of the month to ensure Saturday morning delivery to the Habitat worksite.

Lunches are to be placed in one of the two refrigerators in the Christus Center Kitchen area. Volunteers will be supplied with an entry code to access the Kitchen area.

Each volunteer will record the total number of lunches and drinks supplied in the Lunchmaker binder found in the Kitchen area, and initial the entry accordingly.

Participation in the Ministry calls for an active one-year commitment with an option to renew the commitment. Upon completion of the one-year active service, outgoing volunteers are to participate in a substitute bank to allow active volunteers to request substitute assistance when needed. As in all ministries, whenever a volunteer member is unable to serve when scheduled, it is the responsibility of the volunteer member to secure a substitute to fulfill the scheduled obligation.

INFORMATION OF INTEREST:

Habitat for Humanity-Northwest Harris County, together with the support of community churches and neighboring parishes, will build homes for qualified homeowners who have met stringent criteria and who commit service hours to the project as well as work in the building of their own home. St. Ignatius Loyola Catholic Community is one such committed entity who in addition to financial assistance to the project is to supply volunteers to the home builds as well as for needed additional services. The Lunchmaker Ministry is a part of these services.

It is believed that once volunteers undertake service in this Ministry, it will prove to be a very rewarding experience that could result in the continued renewal of service. What better way to live out St. Ignatius Loyola's motto than that of being "*A People for Others*".
